






Classroom layout


As you may have noticed, the classroom is laid out slightly differently to the other classes throughout the school and pupils are sat in groups. This is to allow us to support more children at a time during lessons. Having the tables set out in groups, allows for us to have a carpet space. Sitting at a table for a longer period of time is a natural progression from Reception to transition to more formal learning. Having the carpet area is great for discussion activities and active learning. Your child will only be sat at their tables when they are completing their written work, which will aid handwriting.

Daily reading

It is really important that your child/ren read for 20 minutes daily! This will aid their writing skills and ability to access the wider curriuclum.


Asking a range of questions will also help to develop their comprehension and inference skills.

Pupils can bring in their finished reading books on any day and place them in the 'finished book' box with their diary.

These will be changed and pupils will be given a new book at the end of the day.

Pupils will continue to be taught daily phonics lessons. We are bringing in something new this year. Every time a child learns a new sound, they will receive a flash card, which they can practise at home with you. Pupils will also receive a pack of flashcards containing the sounds they have already learnt with Miss Tierney last year. These will go home in an envelope with your child next week.

Multiplication timetables



Regularly practising times tables allows your children to become confident mathematicians.

Each week, your child will be given a times table that they need to work on. They will then be quizzed on these weekly.

Handwriting



As a school, we are implementing a new handwriting scheme: Letter Join. Your child/ren will also be given login details so that they can access the platform at home – from a desktop or a tablet! This works well to further support their handwriting skills, as well as their spellings.

More information about this will follow shortly.

Weekly spellings

Each week your child will be given 10 spellings that they will need to learn, these words will be ones that they need to know in regards to the national curriculum. They will also be quizzed on these weekly.
