# PGL - September 2018

All of the children have now signed up for our exciting residential which will provide learners with opportunities to take risks, try new activities and team build with their new class. Mrs Lester and myself will

be visiting the site on Saturday 23rd to check out the brand new facilities. A short meeting will take place in

September to give parents and carers more information about the trip.

#### New Uniform

On Tuesday, we showed parents and carers our new uniform for September 2018, thank you for your positive feedback and I have collated your questions and the answers are below. Please contact us for a question form if you have any more queries or questions.

#### Will all children wear a tie?

Yes, all children will wear a shirt and tie. The tie will be a clip on and we will review this in one year to see if we feel a 'normal' tie would be better. We have taken advice and a clip on tie has been recommended to us at this stage.

#### Where can uniform be sourced from?

All children are asked to wear a logo jumper, school tie and for girls the kilt - these items can be purchased from school trends - the online supplier we have used previously. Shirts, grey trousers and grey shorts can be purchased from supermarkets and other retailers. For girls the purple check summer dress is available online at school trends and can be sourced from other retailers.

### What bags are available?

We have made the decision to remove the school rucksack as an option as they are very bulky and cause many problems in our cloakrooms. At school trends there is a KS2 school bag and a book bag available with the school logo on. School caps and hats are not available at the moment; this will be reviewed next year.

#### What is the PE kit?

Polo shirts with the school logo on (available on school trends) and black shorts or skorts.

# Can they wear long and short sleeved shirts?

Yes, either is fine, embroidered or frilly accessories on shirts will not be part of the new uniform policy.

#### Is there a cardigan for girls?

No, we have made the decision to not offer a cardigan. We have given this a lot of thought and jumpers look smarter. The school jumpers are for boys and girls with the school logo on. Other purple plain items will not be part of the new uniform policy.

#### Can the girls wear grey skirts?

In the interim girls can wear grey skirts as they grow out of their current uniform, from September 2020 the kilt will be compulsory. Girls are welcome to wear grey trousers or shorts as an alternative.

#### Can boys wear trousers or shorts?

Boys can choose between grey trousers or shorts.

#### Is there a school coat?

Yes, there is a school coat available at school trends - this is optional. The uniform policy will state that other coats should be black or dark in colour.

#### Do I need to buy it for September 2018?

No - all families have 2 years to roll over to the new uniform, thus spacing out financial implications and giving time for the children to grow out of the old uniform. The new uniform will be compulsory for all by September 2020

#### Can the children wear hair bows?

Yes but they must be of a small size and purple or black.

# What colour shoes will the children need?

Black shoes or plain black leather look trainers.

#### What colour socks can the children wear?

Girls should wear white socks. Boys should wear black socks.

## Can the children wear tights?


Yes - Grey only.


