

Procedures for the start of the day

- The school gate will be opened at 8:45.
- From 8:45, parents and carers to drop off their children.
- Children enter the school via the black gate and go to their classrooms.

Procedures at the end of the day

- Pupils are dismissed at 15:15.
- Staff to hand pupils over to parents/carers.











Gates

All pupils to enter and leave the school using the **black gate** at the side of the Reception and Years 1&2 classrooms. All other gates will be locked. Parents/Carers to enter and leave, using the black gate.

Pupils who arrive late, to go to the main office.

At the end of the school day, parents/carers can enter the school site via the black gate and wait for their child to be handed over to them by the class teacher. Parents/Carers of pupils in Years 3-6 to congregate just past the wooded cow gate. Teachers will call pupils once parents have been seen to be handed over.

School Rules

Pupils and staff have worked collectively on setting 7 school rules. These rules will be displayed within the 7 colours of the rainbow:

- 1) Walk around the school quietly and safely.
- 2) Take care of school property and environment.
- 3) Try our best, taking pride in all we do.
- 4) Use kind words, hands and feet.
- 5) Be polite and respectful.
- 6) Listen and tell the truth.
- 7) Behave and do what is right.



Curriculum

The curriculum has been streamlined to ensure that the National Curriculum aims are fully covered. In addition pupils will also receive some access to online learning portals. Passwords and logins will be sorted in the coming weeks.

Pupils will be challenged regarding their learning stamina. We will continue to have a good balance between learning and having fun. Staff will also be planning termly educational visits to extend learning outside of the classroom.

Essex has made changes to the RE curriculum, and has adopted the *Norfolk RE syllabus*. We will be delivering this alongside *Discovery RE*. We will also be following the diocese' *Goodness and Mercy* PSHE/RSHE curriculum alongside *LifeWise*.

Amendment to school calendar dates

Government has legislated for an 'extra' bank holiday on Thursday 2 June 2022, to supplement the already 'moved' usual late May bank holiday to Friday 3rd June, in recognition of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

As both of these dates fall in the normal, already scheduled summer half term break, legislation has also been amended for the 2021-22 academic year to require that there are only 189 'teaching days' (378 sessions), as opposed to the standard 190 teaching days.

As a result, Essex County Council, which sets the term dates for community and voluntary controlled schools has amended the term dates calendar for 2021-22 so that the summer term will now end on **Thursday 21 July 2022**, instead of the previous end of term date of Friday 22 July 2022 (which will now be a non-school day).
