#### **Parent governor**

We are looking for a Parent Governor!

The governing body is responsible for both the conduct of the school and for promoting high standards. The governing body carries out its role by setting the vision for the school and then ensuring that the school works efficiently and effectively towards achieving that vision. It does this by building a thorough knowledge of the school and its community, by both supporting and constructively challenging the school, and by ensuring accountability and compliance. The governing body of our school is made up of parent, staff, co-opted and Foundation governors.













A vacancy has arisen for a parent governor on our governing body. The governing body is asking you to nominate someone (maybe yourself!) with parental responsibility for a child at the school. If we receive more than one nomination, then a ballot will be held.

Before you decide to nominate someone, or indeed stand yourself, you may want to know a bit more about what is involved. Governors do not need to be experts in the field of education. What they do need is an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved. The skills you have can be very useful to the governing body. Governors need what is known as 'soft skills' – the ability



to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information. All governors are expected to be able to read straightforward budget reports and data on school standards.

Our governing body expects governors to:

- attend 6 half-termly meetings of the full governing body
- visit the school formally for monitoring purposes at least 2-3 times a term/year
- visit the school informally at least 2 times a year
- commit to attend training courses, perform additional research as required.

In return, our governing body commits to:

- · provide you with a structured induction
- provide access to quality training via Juniper
- provide you with an experienced governor as mentor
- provide informal feedback on your contribution to the governing body on a bi-annual basis

#### **COVID.... More information**

On Saturday 27 November, the Prime Minister <u>announced</u> new temporary measures following the emergence of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 in the UK. As a result, the Prime Minister announced that face masks would need to be worn in shops and on public transport from Tuesday, 30 November.

The DfE has advised that face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors (accept those exempt) in all communal areas.

#### Attendance

School attendance is mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age and it is a priority to ensure that as many children as possible regularly attend school.

As a school we will continue with the following control measures:

- Hand and respiratory hygiene
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes, using standard products such as detergents
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

#### **Testing**

- Testing remains voluntary but is strongly encouraged.
- All educational and childcare settings should continue to encourage staff and students to test twice weekly using lateral flow device (LFD) tests.

#### When an individual develops COVID-19 symptoms or has a positive test

- They should not come into school if:
  - they have symptoms,
  - have had a positive test result or
  - other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine or they are a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19).
- If anyone IN school develops COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, they will be sent home and they should follow public health advice.
- For everyone with symptoms, they should avoid using public transport and, wherever possible, be collected by a member of their family or household.
- The household (including any siblings) should follow the UKHSA stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

#### Contact tracing and isolation

- The current guidance on contact tracing and isolation remains in place.
- In addition to these, any suspected or confirmed close contacts of the Omicron variant will be asked to isolate for 10 days regardless of vaccination status or age.
- You will be contacted directly and told to isolate.

#### **Self-isolation**

- Staff and pupils with a positive LFT result should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.
- They will also need to get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19.
- Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate.
- If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it
  overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual
  doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.











#### Tracing close contacts and isolation

- Close contacts in schools are now identified by NHS Test and Trace and education settings are not expected to undertake contact tracing. As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent to identify close contacts.
- All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of
  the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will be contacted
  directly and required to self-isolate immediately and asked to book a PCR test. They will be
  informed by the local health protection team or NHS Test and Trace if they fall into this
  category and provided details about self-isolation.
- For everyone else, isolation rules are unchanged. Individuals are not required to self-isolate if
  they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 who is not a suspected or
  confirmed case of the Omicron variant, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 who
  is not a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant, and any of the following apply:
  - they are fully vaccinated
  - they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
  - they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
  - they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons.
