"As children are living in an increasingly digital world, it is vitally important that they are able to separate fact from fiction and challer misinformation they




fiction and challenge or question any misinformation they may come across."

Volunteers – painting of the school interior


I am seeking to gauge if there might be anyone willing to volunteer over a weekend to help with painting the walls of our school's interior. (Paint will be provided!).

Parent governor vacancy

There is a vacancy on the governing body for a parent representative. Please contact the school office if you are interested to stand. We will then email you a form to be completed and request two recommendations. An election will take place if there are a number of candidates. A copy of the terms of office will also be emailed to interested individuals. Term of office is 4 years.





The governor role is strategic rather than operational. Governors don't get involved with the day to day running of a school, instead supporting and challenging the school's leadership team to drive school improvement.

Governors usually attend around 6 meetings a year. Being a school governor is a commitment and a responsibility, but offers you the chance to see first-hand the impact you can make in improving education for children in your community.

So what is a parent governor? Governing bodies usually have between 2-4 parents on the governing body, who represent the parent community.

PTA

PTA activities can vary from school to school. The main aim is to be involved in fundraising and social events for pupils, parents and

Remote home learning

A big thanks to our wonderful teaching staff, for working so hard in preparing resources for remote learning and making weekly welfare calls. Staff is doing a fantastic job delivering remote education to our pupils and students, whilst continuing to be under enormous pressure dealing with the impact of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

The Department for Education (DfE) have advised that schools and colleges do not have to offer live lessons. "Remote teaching will include both recorded



or live direct teaching time, and time for pupils and students to complete tasks and assignments independently. Online video lessons do not necessarily need to be recorded by teaching staff at the school or college. Oak National Academy lessons, for example, can be provided in lieu of school or college led video content. Schools and colleges are best placed to decide on the most appropriate approach to teaching their pupils effectively."

A big thank you to our parent community, for supporting your children at home. We have had very positive feedback regarding the standard of resources provided. I do however acknowledge that there might be different preferences to ways of receiving our remote learning offer of provision.

A kind reminder:

• Children to return completed work to their class teacher. This can be done via email.

<u>PE – Results for the 1km Run Down Challenge</u> Congratulations to those who took part at home with the 1km run.

15 schools entered with 306 participants ranging from Reception to Year 6, combining in 306,000m (306km) travelled a fantastic achievement. That is the equivalent of London to York!!!

See the results table for schools below (Distance covered by School). (Some schools only sent their fastest runners so not all 305 runners' results are on there).



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When emotions explode

Last year and the start of 2021 has been extra stressful and, understandably emotions may be heightened at home. It's normal to feel frustrated, worried or angry about the situation, but it can be hard to know how to communicate in these very emotional or angry moments.

This poster aims to support parents when their child has angry feelings or outbursts and may help families start a conversation and talk about each other's feelings.

Very Angry

Stay calm.
Stay safe. walk
away if possible and
make sure you don't.
engage with your
child until you are
both calm.

Frustrated

Reflect what you can see in your child. 'I can see that you're angry/upset' 'I understand that this might be difficult for you.' I understand when you did x this made you feel..'

Calm

Use this time to explore your concerns and ask questions like 'what happened there? How did you feel?' If there has been lots of conflict reassure them and remind them you still love and care about them.


When emotions explode (Young Minds)
