My heartfelt thanks to an amazing and committed community.



Due to a positive COVID case, years 3, 4 and 5 pupils are to self-isolate for 10 days and to return back to school on **Tuesday**, 20th July.






DANIEL in the lions' den

Daniel loved God with all his heart.


He prayed to God lots of times every day.







