
Headteacher's message

A big congratulations to Freddy G, who is a prize winner of the Fyfield Focus Poster Competition, held in the summer, encouraging people not to drop litter and keep our lovely countryside pristine. We are so proud of you! Well done!



In assembly this week, I reminded pupils to bring a water bottle to school. Kindly be advised that pupils should only bring water in these bottles (not squash or fizzy drinks), as we are keen to work towards achieving a Healthy Schools award and status. Pupils are asked to not keep their water bottles on their tables, as this can lead to spillage and impact negatively on book presentation. Water bottles will be kept in a tray in the class. Pupils will have access to their water bottles throughout the day.

Toileting is another issue that I discussed in assembly. Pupils are encouraged to go to the toilet during break and lunch. We have had several disruptions during lesson time over the last two weeks, by pupils wanting to go to the toilet immediately after returning from break and/or lunch. 


The Letter-join Home Subscription allows your pupils and their parents to log in to Letter-join on their PCs and laptops as well as their iPads and tablets.
