St George's day

Saint George's Day, also called the Feast of Saint George, is the feast day of Saint George as celebrated by various Christian Churches and by the several nations, kingdoms, countries and cities of which Saint George is the patron saint including England, Bulgaria, Georgia, Portugal, Spain (Catalonia and Aragon).

Saint George's Day is normally celebrated on 23 April. However, Church of England rules denote that no saints' day should be celebrated between Palm Sunday and the Sunday after Easter Day so if 23 April falls in that period the celebrations are transferred to after it.

23 April is the traditionally accepted date of the saint's death in the Diocletianic Persecution of AD 303.

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
