












	What are we planning for Year 6 leavers?

PSHE/RSHE	<ul> <li>INFORMATION: <ul> <li>The Department for Education has introduced changes from September 2020:</li> <li>6.1 Relationships Education is compulsory in all Primary Schools</li> <li>6.2 Health Education is compulsory in all Primary Schools</li> </ul> </li> <li>The new guidance replaces the DfE Sex and Relationships Education Guidance from 2000. Sex Education is not compulsory in primary schools and the content set out in this guidance therefore focuses on Relationships Education as well as links to Health Education.</li> <li>Although Sex Education is not compulsory, the DfE however, continues to recommend that all primary schools should have a Sex Education programme tailored to the age and the physical and emotional maturity of the pupils.</li> <li>We are following the guidance of the Church of England's Goodness and Mercy Scheme to deliver PSHE/RSHE.</li> <li>We will deliver Sex Education in line with the Science National Curriculum, focusing on: <ul> <li>Puberty</li> <li>Naming of external body parts</li> <li>Human development from birth to old age and</li> <li>Reproduction in animals and plants.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Can parents withdraw their children from the lessons?</li> <li>There is no right for parents to excuse their child from Relationships, Health Education or Science.</li> <li>As Sex Education is not taught at KS1, there is no need to consider the right of withdrawal for their pupils.</li> <li>In KS2 puberty and changing bodies are taught in Health Education and Science. Parents have no right to withdraw from this.</li> <li>Parents do have the right to withdraw their children from Sex Education as this is not compulsory in Primary Schools.</li> </ul>










### Shakespeare workshops
