




Lent is a period of 40 days during which Christians remember the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus Christ, whose life and teachings are the foundation of Christianity.

The 40-day period is called Lent after an old English word meaning 'lengthen'.

This is because of the time of year when it happens, as this is when the days start to get longer, as we approach Summer.

What is Lent?




It is a time of reflection and of asking for forgiveness, and when Christians prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at the feast of Easter, which comes at the very end of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, churches hold special services, at which worshippers are marked with ash.

This is a symbol of death and remembering bad things that we have done, and is where the day gets its name from.

Typically, the ash is made from burning special crosses made out of palm wood, which were used in church services on the previous year's Palm Sunday. It is sometimes mixed with special oil.













Helen Craig, our Diocesan Schools Adviser & Collective Worship Lead, has shared the following message with us on Lent.

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest"

Matthew 11:28.

This year the Bishop of Chelmsford invites us to use the period as a Holy Sabbatical. It is an opportunity for us to pause, reflect on the changes that we have experienced during the past two years and then set our faces to the future, pressing into what God is calling us towards.

It is a time in which we can look for opportunities for prayer and reflection with our leadership team and staff. This time of rest can also be reflected in collective worship with our children as we embrace the Holy Sabbatical across our whole Diocesan family.

Bishop Guli has recorded a Lent message for our schools, which can be incorporated into your Collective Worship. Further details are below. You can also view the Holy Sabbatical introduction from Bishop Guli, along with resources and readings on the <u>Diocese of Chelmsford website</u>.

I leave you with a beautiful poem by Hafiz, a 14th Century Persian poet, whose words encourage and lighten our hearts. I hope you find the time to reflect, replenish and renew this Lent.






Year 5 / 6

A winner was selected from each year group, and received a prize:


