This week in Science the children have been learning about the human body and the different parts. The children had to draw around each other and then label the different parts!








In arts and crafts club with Miss Snow the children made fireworks!

Orange-**Yellow Class**




We had a great morning at Love Lane Sports Ground this week, participating in the Cross Country event against four other local schools.








Indigo-Violet Class


In Maths, we are currently focusing on the four operations. In this block, Year 6 have the opportunity to recap prior learning as Year 5 are introduced to the content for the first time.

Building on previous year groups, children add and subtract larger numbers and use their skills to solve problems.


Children then focus on multiplication and division. Year 5 break down their learning into 5 small steps, however Year 6 use this opportunity to build their skills towards their final

aim of multiplying up to 4-digits by 1 or 2-digit numbers. Finally we work on division – understanding when to use the different methods.

Where possible and appropriate, we provide additional clubs and use resources to support pupils and extend the curriculum outside of the classroom, such as initiatives, and educational visits to further enhance learning. These will at times require asking for financial voluntary contributions.



Unfortunately, due to the size of the school and staffing numbers, these activities can at times be limited. This is also true for sporting events.

We have booked initiatives for this term and are really excited about December's activities and events. The parent community has been amazing with coming forward with suggestions and ideas. Please liaise with the class representatives as events needs to fit within the school's strategic calendar and also the priorities of the school. Our focus this year is on the Quality of Teaching and Learning.

We are delighted that our KS1 and KS2 pupils all had the opportunity to attend an event hosted by West Essex Schools Sports Partnership (WESSP) over the last two weeks. We will plan again to participate in organised events next term (and termly moving forward). This is an improvement from the events last year where only a selected few could attend. Moving forward we will look at events which the whole class can participate in to make it fair.

We appreciate that some parents might be disappointed that we are not doing more competitive sports, however, we are limited to release staff, as staff need to accompany pupils and we have to cater for those staying behind at school. Risk Assessments also need to be completed and measures put in place for those pupils with medical needs and SEND. It is unfortunately not that easy to just attend these events - there are a number of factors to consider.

As a small school, we appreciate that we have a very different "School Core Offer" compared to other schools. Schools' Core Offers will thus be different and at best of times also create disappointment, when compared.

It is very much like going to restaurants and looking at different menus. Some might prefer a vegetarian option, others more adventurous carnivorous or omnivorous ones, and some may even prefer simplistic culinary artworks to feast their senses on. Whatever the choice, it is personal and should be respected, both by the individual making the choice and the person offering the "menu." Said in another way, if you were to go shopping at a supermarket and you don't find the product you need, you will continue your search elsewhere.

Thank you for the positive comments we have received from parents regarding the sporting events and other initiatives offered by school. It is heart-warming to know that pupils are enjoying these.

We look forward to planning and offering initiatives and events where appropriate and possible.

We are encouraging parents to also look at alternative clubs and sporting providers outside of school if you wish for your child to participate in more competitive events. This is also true for arts, music, etc.

What is Remembrance Day?

Remembrance Day is an annual event, where we remember all the people who have lost their lives while serving in the armed forces. It's also called Armistice Day or Poppy Day.

In Britain, Remembrance Day has been a tradition since the end of the First World War. It's also celebrated in many countries across the globe. People from different backgrounds, cultures, and religions come together to honour Remembrance Day.

We remember the bravery and courage of those who fought in the World Wars on Remembrance Day. But, we also commemorate all those who have served in the army since, and those who are serving in the army today.



When is Remembrance Day 2022?

Remembrance Day 2022 will take place on Thursday 11 November. Remembrance Day is celebrated every year on the 11th of November. This is because during WW1, the conflict ended "at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month".

How is Remembrance Day commemorated in the UK?

From laying wreaths to watching parades, there are lots of ways that people in Britain commemorate Remembrance Day each year.

One important moment that happens every year on Remembrance Day is a two-minute silence. Held at 11:00 a.m. on the 11 November, the silence takes place across the country.

Many TV channels and radio stations ask audience members to join them in holding a silence. There are even announcements about the silence in supermarkets! It's up to each person how they choose to spend their two-minute silence. Usually, people will think about the sacrifices made by people in the armed forces. Or, they will remember loved ones that lost their lives at war.

Wearing a poppy throughout November is another popular way to commemorate Remembrance Day. The red poppy is a sign of remembrance and a symbol of hope for a peaceful future.



Reception 2023 intake	As you may be aware, the primary school (Reception) admission round opened on Monday 7 November 2022, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2023. The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2023. From 7 November 2022, applications can be made via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions 99% of parents in Essex applied online last year. All of the application information is available on the website above.
