

#### **YEAR 6 SATS**


We are so proud of the year 6 pupils for finishing their SATs papers this week. You have done yourselves proud! Well done!



# Farm tour

The Centre's farm is a working, low intensity farm which is managed following permaculture principles where the animals lead a free-range life. We are committed to educating young people about farming, helping them to understand where food comes from and to understand the importance of looking after our environment. The Centre offers the perfect location to get out into the countryside, feel free and breathe fresh air! They offer 10 different

activities which allow groups to have fun on the farm, learn new things and meet a wide range of farm animals.

The Centre boasts 54 acres of countryside. All this space means we can keep a wide variety of animals including cows, sheep, chickens, ducks, geese, pigs, goats, ponies and rabbits.

The space is

used to grow lots of useful and delicious plants and vegetables. As a working farm, they sell their own eggs, vegetables and meat.



#### Low ropes course

This low ropes course is over water - so the challenge is to stay dry! The group move

through the course by completing different sections alone or as a team. If you lose your footing you will fall PLOP! into the cold water below... But do not fear, you will be wearing buoyancy aids and helmets so the worst thing that will happen is you lose a bit of your street cred and get wet.
