

# Headteacher's note:



We had a lovely Thursday, with Essex Deputy Lord Lieutenant, Mrs. Rosemary Padfield, to kick off our Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations at school.

Lord-Lieutenants are Her Majesty's representative in the county and as such will act to protect the dignity and integrity of the office they hold. Aside from royal duties, Lord-Lieutenants generally promote and encourage

voluntary and charitable organisations and take an interest in the business, urban and rural, and social life of the county.

Mrs. Padfield explained to the pupils her role in representing the Queen and wearing the English Rose on such occasions. Men wear military uniform - but this has only recently has been brought in for women.



She read the story of *Little Elizabeth: The Young Princess Who Became Queen*, to our pupils and had a discussion about her majesty's interesting life.



The story goes through the life of The Queen, from being born, growing up in a royal household, changing of role to become a future Queen, her role in the war, marriage, and her coronation.

- Personal, Social and Health Educations (PSHE) helps to give children and young people the knowledge, skills and understanding that they need to lead confident, healthy, and independent lives.
- It aims to help children understand how they are developing personally and socially, tackling many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up
- We recognise that parents/carers are key partners in our delivery of a comprehensive PSHE / RSHE programme for pupils at the school.
- The school is committed to working with parents and believes that it is important to have the support of parents.
- The PSHE / RSHE we deliver is designed to support the important role of parents in this area.
