


### Red-Orange Class






#### Orange-Yellow Class






#### Green-Blue Class

### Indigo-Violet Class


#### Class Register Teacher: Mrs Karin Vorster

In Art, we are looking at line, light and shadows. We are learning about the visual qualities of line, light and shadow. In class, we looked at the work of Pablo Picasso and were introduced to a range of shading techniques.

We have been finding out that preliminary sketches and models are usually simple line drawings or trial pieces of sculpture that are created to explore ideas and techniques to plan what a final piece of art will look like. We started off by adding perspective, light and shade to a composition.

Shading is a technique that artists use to give the illusion of a 3-D form on a 2-D surface. We looked at four different techniques: smudging, cross-hatching, scribbling and contour lines.
