




## Reception Red Class

This week we have learnt more digraphs (2 letters, 1 sound): ff, II, ss, and j.

Years 3 and 4 Green-Blue Class

In English this week, the children have been learning how to write a 'Buddy story'. They have read an example, looked at the features, spoken about the features of a good story and planned their own versions ready to write up next week.

The children enjoyed their first lesson of this halfterm in Computing this week. Their topic is: Programming Scratch. They enjoyed 'tinkering' on Scratch by choosing a 'Sprite' and adding actions. They will be exploring more features of Scratch in the upcoming weeks.

# Feedback from Open meeting between parents, Governors and Staff held on 31.10.23

The meeting was representative of three classes.

General feedback - Parents feel positive about the school and staff with comments made, inclusive of:

- I am impressed with the staff.
- Very impressed with the new staff who joined.
- Teachers know their stuff and clear about the direction of learning this was evident during the meet the teacher session and parent consultation meetings.
- Staff address behaviour well
- Staff are nurturing and praising pupils.
- The "Good to be green" behaviour system works well to promote positive self-esteem.
- Children are all friends in this school.
- Teachers are positive this is the general feel.
- Pupils are well supported.
- Before the start of the year, some parents were not positive and this caused issues, but the school year has really started well on a positive note.
- There is a massive positive change in school, making parents feel confident and positive about the school.
- Changes around the school have been positive.
- Parents do share the positives on WhatsApp which is great.

**Parent consultation evenings -** Parents were positive about the parent consultation meeting and particularly happy with seeing how the marking policy is used in marking of books and positive comments their children receive.

**Homework -** Homework was discussed to consider online set work vs. paper worksheets. Some pupils find online work difficult as not all parents have access to laptops or tablets and mobile phone screens are small. There is also the issue of screen time at home. It was explained that schools don't need to set homework, but that we provide homework to embed learning. Parents agreed that it is difficult to please all requests. The school will look into options regarding homework, as long as it does not increase teachers' workload, e.g. to consider a choice of work, projects, etc. Pupils need to read daily at home and practise timetables.

**New staff** – New staff have made a good start. Parents are positive about the new staff. It needs to be acknowledged that new staff need to find their feet with new systems, policies and schemes and therefore should not be compared with staff who have been here longer. We are supportive of our staff, pupils and parents alike. If parents have queries, they need to discuss this with teachers in the first instance.

**Volunteers** – We need volunteers to help in school – especially as volunteer readers. Please contact the school office so that we can action applications for DBS checks. Once this is in place we can also look at parent volunteers to run clubs.

**Public relations** – It was suggested to make more contact with pre-schools and nurseries to promote the school. Volunteers are happy to drop off leaflets to promote Dr Walker's C of E. We will be inviting pre-schools and nurseries in to attend some of our initiatives and also arrange for joined up activities with our reception class.

**Negatives vs Positives** – It is noted that there will always be some negative comments, however the positives outway these. Our focus should be on our pupils' learning and their learning experiences. Pupils feel safe and happy in school. Parents commented that they acknowledge that change does not happen overnight, but that the school has made very positive changes. The Open days are great and amazing feedback has been received. Parents also feel that the class sizes are good and a positive for the school.

**Fundraising** – There will be a Christmas Disco for pupils at the end of term. There will be no Christmas bazaar, however we will do fundraising through a tombola table and raffles. If anyone would like to help with these (and in getting sponsorships for raffle prizes, please contact the school). It was suggested that the school ask for a minimum for £1 donations for non-uniform days to help with school funds. We will have a fundraiser for pupils to be the HEADTEACHER FOR THE DAY. One pupil will be drawn from entries.

**Clubs** – Suggestions made for consideration were; breakfasts with parents and their children and potential clubs (e.g. a film club with volunteers overseeing this on a rota).
