
Newsletter Summer Term – 09.06.23





In History, we are learning about the Groundbreaking Greeks. This week we made comparisons between the lives of the Minoans and those of the Mycenaeans.

The Minoan civilization was a civilization on Crete. It began in the Bronze Age between 3000 and 2700 BC. It lasted until about 1450 BC. The Minoan civilization is famous for its sea trading and well-planned cities. The Minoans had an agricultural system which relied mainly on olives and grapes. Their religion worshipped mostly goddesses. The Minoan civilization was later replaced by the Mycenaean culture.

The Mycenaean culture (1600–1100BC) was an early Greek culture during the Bronze Age, on the Greek mainland and on Crete.

The name Achaean was used by the legendary author Homer to describe them, and occurs in the Iliad (oldest surviving work of Greek literature). The term we use is derived from Mycenae, which is an important archaeological site about 90 km from Athens (Athens is the capital city of Greece. It is one of the most famous cities in the world. The city is named after Athena, a goddess in Greek mythology).

Other important Mycenaean sites are at Athens, Thebes, Tiryns and Pylos. The epic poems of Homer, the Iliad and the Odyssey, are Mycenaean in origin.
