Well done! We are so proud of you!



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
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Year 6 Leavers

Feedback from the Parent Survey / Questionnaire

We know that the school is making good progress and that pupils are safe and happy at our small village school. Our pupils in Reception and Key Stage 1 have improved on attainment outcomes compared to last year's results. Our Year 6 pupils scored 83% for writing at Are Related Expectation. We are proud of the progress pupils are making.

Our latest parent survey has conveyed the following comments:

We are conscious that our numbers are small and therefore want to make a concerted effort for positive Public Relations to get out to the community. There are spaces in all our year groups and we welcome prospective parents to contact the school for more information or to arrange to come and view the school. Our Governing Body is very supportive and would love to engage with prospective pupils and parents.

It is true that from time to time, there might be different viewpoints in doing things in school, however we always have the best interest of pupils at heart, including safety and Risk Assessment. And that might mean, that sometimes things cannot happen in school due to challenges and timeframes – we had a number of challenges the last month with staff absences, etc. We would like to thank all parents for your patience and trust in the school and encourage you to participate in arranging and attending events. A meeting will be scheduled in Autumn term to discuss fundraising events and other initiatives for the year.

Next year we will continue with the open meetings for parents to share their comments and ideas. Please be reminded to refrain from making negative comments on social media, as these are personal opinions and not the general opinion of the school, which is upsetting to the community.

We are looking forward to next year and have already made bookings for:

- our year 6 pupils to attend a residential,
- a visit from Paul Sturgess (a British former professional basketball player; officially measured by Guinness World Records in November 2011 as the tallest college basketball player in the United States),
- A circus workshop,
- the Dogs' Trust and
- possible hatching ducklings.

School gate	Kindly be informed that the big school gate at the parking area will be locked as of Septemebr in the mornings, due to safety reasons. The parking area will not be accessible for vehicles in the mornings. Please plan your morning drop off ahead of time.
School Uniform	School Trends are urging parents to place orders for new uniform by the end of July, please do also bear in mind that we have a large stock of preloved items, particularly smaller jumpers sized 24 and 26 inches and smaller kilts. We have these for sale. Please can we also ask everyone to double check they have the correct PE items as a number of named hoodies have been lost recently. Please do check the lost property in reception regularly for any missing uniform.
Warm weather	 Pupils are encouraged to drink lots of water to stay hydrated during the warm weather. Please fill water bottles with water – fizzy and fruit drinks are not allowed. Pupils are allowed to come to school with sandals with a back strap – no flip flops or sliders allowed. Pupils do not need to wear ties. Pupils are encouraged to wear a hat when outside during break and lunch. Sun screen is advised, but needs to be put on before coming to school. During very warm days, we will minimize pupils' running (or temporarily stop football) during this heat, as pupils don't pace themselves and come in looking puce and wet with sweat. We would not want pupils to be uncomfortable once returned to the classroom after being outside.
