



Welcome to yet another end of a busy week in Indigo-Violet class. On Monday we started our first after school booster session for year 6. It was lovely to see so many children attend. Thank you to all the children and parents for signing up to this commitment.

To kick-start our Science celebration period, the Birdman visited our school on Monday 13th March. First we had an assembly where he told us all about birds of prey, sustainability and the importance of looking after our world. After that children had the opportunity to hold one of the birds and have a picture taken. We all agreed that it was a lot of fun and very interesting.

Facts and statistics:

- More than 560 species of birds of prey (also known as raptors) live around the world and raptors can be found on every continent (except Antarctica).
- As apex predators, birds of prey play an important ecological role in maintaining the environmental health of their natural habitat. They remove old, sick and weak animals from prey populations and help keep these populations under control.
- Raptors fly in ways that help them hunt, such as **gliding and soaring** to spot prey and **powerful dives and agile pursuit** to capture prey.
- Most birds of prey are quite solitary as they avoid competition for food. Many of those that gather in flocks do so only as part of peak migration periods or at winter feeding grounds.
- The farthest-traveling bird of prey is the Amur falcon, which migrates from Siberia to South Africa, a distance of around 22,000 kilometres (13,600 miles).



Book Fair	Thank you SO much for your support during our school's Book Fair. Your generosity has provided the school with £308.13 to spend on new books for the children!
Notice board	We have moved the notice board to the front entrance for better visibility and communication, so please do have a look as you walk through at the beginning of the school day.
New gates	The gate should remain unlocked between 8:20 and 8:45am to allow entry and exit without needing to press the call button. After this time you will need to use the call button on the front to request entry. The exit release button is at the top of the final fence post on the right hand side as you are leaving.
Attendance: Penalty notices and/or prosecution	Please be informed of guidance from the Local Authority regarding holidays taken during term time. Important information - Term time holidays Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found guilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.
Reminder	Please do not enter the building when dropping off or collecting your children from school. If you wish to speak with the Class Teacher please arrange this via the school office.
