

#### Open meeting: 16 May 2023 - Discusion notes

We had a very positive meeting on Tuesday. It was attended by 4 parents, 7 governors, the Headteacher and one teacher.

- Communication: Parents feel that the communication in the school is positive and would like the weekly newsletter to continue. Parents conveyed that they feel the school looks great and that parents are more involved. This is positive and the general feel is positive. It was also noted that communication on WhatsApp groups is more positive. It was suggested to gauge the interest of using WhatsApp to do quick surveys to get feedback from parents.
- Mini-report cards and end of year report: Parents appreciate that progress cards are shared to inform them of their child's progress and attainment. Parents would like this to be be shared termly and to be distributed in advance of parent consultation meetings. The school will add context to the mini-reports to help parents with understanding the assessment and attainment criteria and data. Visual faces and colour codes will be removed. There was a discussion about the purpose of the reports, namely to inform parents of their child's progress and whether it should be shared with pupils. The end of year reports will portray the information required by the DfE. There will be an opportunity for parents to give feedback or arrange a meeting with the current class teacher at the end of the Summer term 2, once end of year reports have been sent home. The Headteacehr has already liaised with our Partnership schools, to use an End of Year report template, similar to the other schools. Pupil voice will be included in the final reports.
- Class visits and assemblies: These are much welcomed and appreciated. Parents acknowledged
  that the school has much improved and commented that it is lovely to see what is really happeing
  in school. Pupils are happy and safe.
- **Public Relations:** The school provides regular articles fo the Ongar News and Fyfield Focus. However, we know that word of mounth is a powerful tool and would urge all parents to spread the positives about the school, as this will also contribute to us drawing prospective pupils to increase pupil numbers.
- Mini-Summer fete: To take place on the last day of term (20 July). This will be arranged in liaison with class reps. Rev Sam Brazier-Gibbs and Lesley Wallis will co-ordinate/oversee this. We will have a picnic during lunch with pupils and parents followed by a mini-summer fete with stalls.
- Strategic calendar: As there is no PTFA, the Headteacher suggested to parents to arrange a meeting with class representatives at the end of Summer term to plan for specific events for the new academic year. This will allow for fundraising events to be planned well in advance, but also to spread events out across the year. Events will require a full Risk Assessment to be carried out by those who are arranging them, and to be submitted to the Headteacher for approval.
- Clubs / Teatime club: Discussion followed on the available clubs due to staffing and also that clubs need to be self-funding to make it viable to be offered. The school would like to offer more clubs to broaden pupils' horizons e.g. music apprecation, cookery, etc. The headteacher to look into guidance on volunteers running clubs.
- **Pre-loved clothes:** It was suggested that if anyone has pre-loved clothes, to donate these to the school as it would be great to offer these to parents and pupils for next year especially the new reception intake pupils.
- Parent governor: The Chair of Governors reminded parents of the two vacancies for parent governors on the Governing Body.



#### <u>Arrangements for next year:</u>

- Parents will be informed of classes and teaching staff for next year, as soon as we have these confirmed and sorted. This will be shared earlier than last year.
- The new Reception pupils will be invited in to a Teddy bear's picnic too!
- The school will welcome any prospective parents to come and view the school.


#### SATURDAY 17.06.23 - Is this happening???


Please make sure your child has their reading record in school every day as we write in these during our reading sessions.
