Dr Walker's C of E Primary had a wonderful year, with lots to celebrate. We had a number of improvements and developments:

- Two brand new classrooms built
- Key Stage 2 classrooms redecorated and a new access ramp installed
- The EYFS classroom has been revamped and redecorated with new resources purchased
- An outdoors traffic track for Reception
- New multi-sports goalposts
- Multi-sports playground markings
- A new Adventure trail
- New PE and sport equipment
- · New multi-colour seating in the playground
- A new fence installed in front of school to make it more secure.

Over the holidays we will see:

- the installation of an outdoor gym for our pupils;
- an outdoor recreation area for table tennis;
- An interactive "Lighthouse Keeper's lunch" themed reading area (with a real boat!);
- A reflection garden; and
- EYFS to have a brand new outdoors reading shed.

Our new reception pupils who will be joining us in September, were invited in to school for a Teddy Bears picnic with their assigned school buddies and also came in for a stay and play session as part of meeting their class teacher for next year.

School continued to stay open on the Industrial Teacher Strike days – albeit partially. We had an exciting Summer Sports Day. Pupils participated in water sponge and space hopper races. There was also a tug of war. Parents also had the opportunity to participate. We had lots of fun!

West Essex Schools Sport Partnership (WESSP) delivered additional sporting sessions in school and Key Stage 2 pupils attended their Athletic festival.

As a school, we take safety seriously, and do termly fire drills. The Fire Brigade service came in to share with our pupils about the work they do in the community and did a demonstration. All pupils had the opportunity to "be a fire fighter."

We sadly had to say farewell to our Year 6 pupils. We all attended a Year 6 leavers services at St Nicholas Church. Many thanks to Mrs Lesley Wallis (church Warden) and Rev Sam Brazier-Gibbs for organising this.

Our pupils will continue to benefit from special PE lessons, twice per week delivered by Sports Coaching Specialists (SCS), who has been awarded the UK Enterprise Award for Best Sports Coaching Provider in Essex 2023

We know that the school is making good progress and that pupils are safe and happy at our small village school. Our pupils in Reception and Key Stage 1 have improved on attainment outcomes compared to last year's results. Our Year 6 pupils scored 83% for writing at Age Related Expectation, which is above National Averages. Our SPAG and Science is also above National Averages, with Maths being in line with National Averages. We are proud of the progress pupils are making.

Our latest parent survey has conveyed the following comments:

Our Governing Body is very supportive and would love to engage with prospective pupils and parents.

As of September, pupils across the school will be receiving a music lesson from Essex Music Services every two weeks – an opportunity to either learn or play the ukulele or percussion instruments such as glockenspiels.

We are looking forward to next year and have already made bookings for:

- our year 6 pupils to attend a residential,
- a visit from Paul Sturgess (a British former professional basketball player; officially measured by Guinness World Records in November 2011 as the tallest college basketball player in the United States).
- a circus workshop, and
- possible hatching ducklings.

All the pupils received a farewell goddy-bag!


