
have been working really hard to help with the improvements. Thank you to all the parents who helped out on Saturday.





to die on the Cross.


The soldiers came to get him.

"Go and tell your friends the good news."




# THIS is the tomb - Finger play rhyme

The first Easter was when, Jesus was not seen for the day, For the soldiers took Him away.


The first Easter as when, The clouds were mad, But believers were sad.
