


# Newsletter (4) tumn Term - 29.09.2023

## **Classroom News**



#### Reception Red Class

This week we have learnt g, o, c and k.
We have also learnt our first tricky word: is.
You can consolidate the learning here.

In maths we have looked at patterns and have been able to create our own and complete patterns, recognising the next object in the sequence. We have now begun to look at numbers, in particular 1, 2 and 3. See if your child can spot these numerals in the environment and encourage them to show you the representation with their fingers!



The caterpillars were very, VERY hungry and ate the food ... all but one have now formed its chrysalis in readiness for its transformation into a beautiful butterfly. The children have been observing with their eyes, and know that the transformation process is very delicate.



# Years 1 and 2 Orange-Yellow Class

It has been a busy week for our class.

We completed our voyage and return story and the children could experience how to be a teacher while editing their work, reflecting on mistakes and discussing possible better solutions. We have also had a peek at the poetry we will be discussing within the coming week.



In Maths, we have been carrying on our topic: Place Value. The children have been learning to represent and partition numbers to 1,000 and use a number line.




# Years 5 and 6 Indigo-Violet Class
