

Science and Fossils!

In science, we have been exploring how fossils are made. We found out that the remains of animals and plants, from long ago, can be covered with silt or mud. Sometimes they make a body impression. In class, we made our own fossils

- We used clay to make a muddy base.
- We then pushed objects into the moist clay.
- Impressions were made of the different shapes.
- We then placed a paper collar around the clay, to make a mould.
- We poured plaster into the mould and let it dry.

In the next few days we will remove the clay and examine our new fossils. We will add them to our collections.



We had a very busy week this week. On Tuesday we went to Ongar Sport Centre where we took part in the Sports Hall Athletics competition. We came 4th and enjoyed the morning staying active and representing our school.


Safer Internet day


Synagogue Visit
