
What happened this week in school?

Welcome back and Happy New Year! Upon our return, Reception class has hit the road running and have settled straight back into our daily routine.

We have been learning about castles and features of them, in readiness to write about them next week. We have made crowns, designed our own castle and brainstormed facts that we have learnt about castles.

Our maths skills are really improving and we have been securing our knowledge of subitising (recognising quantities without counting) – whilst not forgetting zero!

We have developed our Home Role Play Area – which now includes playdough, so the children are making all sorts of creations; baking them and wrapping them in foil or storing them in tins!

There has also been an introduction of a Baby Clinic Hospital and Vet Hospital, which the children are really enjoying! This includes weighing, measuring, recording, note taking and tending to 'medical' needs.

Welcome back! I hope you had a restful time and enjoyed the winter break.

The children came back in high spirits with loads of enthusiasm and curiosity for the new things lying ahead.

We have embarked on a new journey with a new book. We are reading Dogger by Shirley Hughes. The children have been acting out the story, discussing the progression of the feelings and tried their best with incorporating some of the new words they learned into written sentences. I wonder if any of my year 1 and 2 has shared their new vocabulary with you?

In maths we are currently finishing our shape unit and very soon we will be revisiting place value with lots of counting and calculations.

The children are looking forward to finding out more about the toys of the past. This half term, we are looking at how the toys have changed, what games our grandparents used to play and exploring the way toys came to be.

We are off to a great term!

In science we have just started a very interesting unit on Rocks and Soils. The whole class enjoyed the introduction. We have challenged the children to bring in a rock that they have found. We will add it to our collection and get the magnifiers out to have a really good look. We have found out that there are three major kinds of rocks.



In maths we are really excited to be learning how to multiply and divide by using associated math facts. 3x5=15 5x3=15 $15\div 5=3$ $15\div 3=5$

We have also been exploring ways to multiply and divide by 10. It has been really interesting and challenging!

Multiplying is Fun!

Welcome back to a cold and wet Spring term. I hope you had a great Christmas and New Year.

In Maths this term, we are finishing our fraction topic and then we will be starting our Spring topics: multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percentages, perimeter and area as well as statistics.

In English, we started looking at writing a quest story. Later this term, we will be debating and look at some 'classic fiction'.

In History we are looking at: What did the Greeks ever do for us.

For RE, we are looking at a Philosophy lens: Why should we be good?

During our Science topic, we will be look at Earth and Space.

I would like to say thank you to every child in Indigo/Violet for their positive attitudes and big smiles that they enter the class with every day.

Spellings	the ind import Counti says th word:	Encourage your child to segment the words that they say. This means to identify each of the individual phonemes in a word, working all the way through from left to right. This is an important first stage of writing (spelling) a word but needs to be practised orally first. Counting the phonemes is often helpful in reinforcing this process. For example: If you child says the word duck, see if they can identify the individual phonemes needed to spell this word: d-u-ck.								
Topic project for the term	Spring 1 - Castles, Knights and Dragons – Traditional Tales We will be exploring castles and looking at past kings and queens. Compare pictures of King Charles III with those of historical Kings. What is similar/ different between the present king and kings in the past? We will find out more about an historical figure who lived in a castle, the people who worked in castles through books and online learning. Spring 2 - Spring in Our Step We will look for signs of Spring and compare this to Autmn and Winter. We will explore mixing colours to paint our own butterflies and will talk about the colours that they mix and what they expect to happen. We will explore the Artist Angela Lewin and water colour


