


Newsletter Spring Term – 15.03.2024

We had a visit from our local counsellor, Jaymey McIvor, who spoke to pupils in assembly about his work and role within the community focusing on a career in politics and local government.


We are very pleased to have welcomed Mrs Snow back following a period of absence. Mrs Snow will be on a phased return to work.

On Thursday, we took part in a live science event. We joined Matt the engineer and Nao the robot to help build an amazing FACTORY OF THE FUTURE!




At the end of the session our factory of the future was CERTIFIED!

Years 5 and 6 **Indigo-Violet Class**

During Science week, our parents had the opportunity to come to our class to look at how we conduct experiments. First, we each received a Curly Wurly and we had to see how far we could stretch it out. The winner was Teddy Da and he/she managed to stretch it up to 419cm! Some materials behave differently according to their temperature. The Curly Wurly stretches better when it's warm because its molecules are spread wider apart, increasing the material's elasticity. When the chocolate and toffee are cold, their molecules are bonded together tightly, keeping it from stretching.

Next we used fizzy water and raisins to create 'dancing' raisins. The carbon dioxide bubbles held onto the raisins and cause them to float up to the surface. When the bubbles popped at the surface of the water the raisin fell back down until more bubbles held onto the raisin causing it to float to the surface again. This process made the raisins look like they were dancing!



Green/Blue class had a wonderful time making Helicopters and learning about all the different experiments with Mr Lewis and Dr Lawson.
