


Next week will be a fun-filled week as usual:

The Gardening Club will run after the Easter break until July the cost will be £38.50 for all 11 weeks.


We are hoping to run a Lego Club after school, please register your interest with the School Office via email, we can only run these clubs if we have enough children to participate.

- Pupils feel happy, safe and cared for.
- The arrangements for safeguarding are effective.
- Pupils are keen to learn and are ambitious to do well.
- The school has made important changes to its curriculum, the school environment and to the early years' provision.
- The school has adopted new programmes that identify what pupils need to know and break down knowledge into clear steps.
- Teachers adapt tasks to meet the needs of pupils with SEND.
- Interventions are often confidently delivered by knowledgeable staff. As a result, weaker readers become more accurate and fluent.
- The school promotes and celebrates reading. Pupils read widely and teachers read to pupils every day.
- Pupils enjoy the many visitors and events that ignite their interest in learning and broaden their knowledge of the wider world.
- There are many opportunities for pupils to develop their confidence and can take on leadership roles.
- Children in Reception become increasingly confident and independent.
- All pupils learn musical instruments such as the ukulele and try out a range of sports including rugby.
- Pupils are well prepared for life in modern Britain.
- Pupils, and their parents, appreciate the support and encouragement that pupils receive from staff.
- Staff feel supported with their well-being and workload.

# Parent discussions with Parent Governor

Graham Laurence (Parent Governor) offered to be available at school for parents to have a chat with him as parent governor, like a drop-in clinic. Please let us know if you would like to speak to Graham.

On Tuesday, 19.03.24, Graham met with three parents. The following was discussed:

- What Ofsted is.
- How judgements on schools are made, namely comparing schools alongside a set of criteria and to help schools to improve even further.
- That the school met all of the previous three key priority points identified by Ofsted.
- Safeguarding is effective and that pupils are happy in school.
- Behaviour and Attitudes and Personal Development have good judgements.
- EYFS had a good judgement, which is evident of the commitment of the school to invest and develop areas.
- The Leadership and Governance of the school are supportive, committed and resilient.
- That the school is supported by the Local Authority (SEP) and C of E Advisor.
- The school is working alongside the Local Authority (SEP) and C of E Advisor to improve the school.
- The LA has supported the school by adding additional capacity to the governing body with two
  experienced governors.
- The Governing Body is to support and challenge the school to make it even better.

Parents feel that the overall parent community is very supportive of the school and that they are glad for the many positives reflected in the report.

- One parent commented that it is unfair to judge the school based on only two days and that parents and staff really know the school well.
- One parent asked if there is a plan to address the areas identified in the new Ofsted report and how the school will be improving on these points. And how this will be shared with parents.
- One parent asked about numbers on roll and the impact of this for the future.
- One parent wanted to know when the school would be re-inspected.
- One parent asked if the school could consider the uniform policy to have purple tops for PE and for pupils to wear these to sporting event.
