Reception **Red Class**

Orange-Yellow Class

This week we have been exploring mass and capacity in maths.

The pupils have been using resources to fill containers and to make predictions about which containers would hold more or less. They were also able to identify that some objects left 'space' between, but if the containers were filled with sand or rice then it was completely full.

The children were also able to discuss and show me containers that were empty, almost empty, almost full and full. They could then find alternative containers and talk about how many of the original containers it would take to fill it.





Years 3 and 4 **Green-Blue Class**

Ready Steady Experiment!

We are having exciting week! As scientists, we have been experimenting rocks on and discovering their properties. We found out that some absorb



water while others don't. Some are soft and others are very hard. But the most exciting experiment was placing some Limestone chips in acid. The rock began to fizz and bubble. It was reacting to acetic acid in vinegar. We discovered that some rocks react to acid rain and in the environment around us.

We have handed out new spelling lists and the pupils will be using these words in games and challenges.

Our book Stig of the Dump is now getting interesting. We need to remember that reading diaries and home books must come in every day to be checked. This week we even had a guest (Mr Lewis) come into the class and read with some of us!



Years 1 and 2

This week's practical science was our focus.

We tested our senses of touch and taste. We had a mysterious bag. Our task was to guess the items in the bag just by touching them. In the bag were items like potato, sea shell, tea light and lemon. It was fun to give it a go. The weirdest was the shell. Later, we worked on our sense of taste. We were dark lemon, spinach, chocolate. marshmallows and crisps. The lesson was very engaging and everyone had a lot of fun!





Years 5 and 6 **Indigo-Violet Class**

In PE, we are improving our fitness.

During our sessions with Mr O'Sullivan, we are completing activities such as push-ups, sit ups, burpees and plank.

We are completing this to increase speed stamina, endurance and power. Throughout every session, we record our scores. This is then used to monitor our progress.



School Councils - National Story Telling Week

Indigo Violet Safeguarding Assembly

On Tuesday 23rd January, we had a theatre company called **ARC** – **theatre for change** come into Indigo/Violet class. They run a program called Broadcast Junior. We had a very entertaining and informative workshop based on online safety and healthy relationships. Firstly we spoke about online safety and how we could report inappropriate behaviour, images and language that we might come across online. We also talked about the PEGI (Pan-European Game Information) rating system that are used in video games. Some of the games' PEGI rating: GTA PEGI 18, Call of Duty PEGI 18. This means that no one under the age of 18 are allowed to play these games.

Being online is an integral part of children and young people's lives. Social media, online games, websites and apps can be accessed through mobile phones, computers, laptops and tablets – all of which form a part of children and young people's online world. The internet and online technology provides new opportunities for young people's learning and growth, but it can also expose them to new types of risks. E-safety should form a fundamental part of schools' and colleges' safeguarding and child protection measures'. NSPCC – March 2022

The actors were then introduced. The play was about 2 cousins: Lyla and Tom. These actors portrayed 2 Year 10 pupils who were being cat fished. The Indigo/Violet children got to call TIME OUT on the play and the play then proceeded in the way that the children chose.

Finally, we heard the very sad story of Breck Bednar, a 17 year old boy, who lived in Essex who was sadly murdered by someone that he met online.

The children were sent away with the very important message: NEVER MEET UP WITH ANYONE YOU'VE NEVER MET BEFORE!

I received an email from Natalie Smith, the Education Director for Arc Theatre. She had the following to say about the children in Indigo/Violet class:

Your students were a great audience for us. They responded extremely well to the drama and we loved their involvement and energy. They were respectful, well behaved and engaged and it felt like the programme had a positive impact on them.

I want to say thank you to each and every child in Indigo/Violet. I am so proud to be your teacher and thank you for behaving in such an outstanding way!

As you are aware, applications closed on 15/01/2024, however, we do have a small window where we can accept late applications, change requests for address changes and to receive evidence of new addresses. This window will close on 02/02/2024.

So, if you have any parents who you are aware did not previously make an application for Reception or Junior 2024, please ask them to make the application as a matter of urgency and before 02/02/2024. Applications received between 15/01/2024 and 02/02/2024 are classified as late, however, they will be ranked with the on time applications and parents will find out the outcome soon after National Offer Day.

Applications received after 02/02/2024, will be held until after National Offer Day, as no changes can be made or applications added after the final closing date.
