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## The invitation

Buckingham Palace shared the invitation for the Coronation, which was issued to over 2,000 guests who will form the congregation in Westminster Abbey. It was also announced that eight Pages of Honour had been chosen to attend Their Majesties during the Coronation Service.

The invitation for the Coronation was designed by Andrew Jamieson, a heraldic artist and manuscript illuminator whose work was inspired by the chivalric themes of Arthurian legend. Mr Jamieson is a Brother of the Art Workers' Guild, of which The King is an Honorary Member.



The original artwork for the invitation was hand-painted in watercolour and gouache, and the design was reproduced and printed on recycled card, with gold foil detailing. Central to the design is the motif of the Green Man, an ancient figure from British folklore, symbolic of spring and rebirth, to celebrate the new reign. The shape of the Green Man, crowned in natural foliage, is formed of leaves of oak, ivy and hawthorn, and the emblematic flowers of the United Kingdom.

The British wildflower meadow bordering the invitation features lily of the valley, cornflowers, wild strawberries, dog roses, bluebells, and a sprig of rosemary for remembrance, together with wildlife including a bee, a butterfly, a ladybird, a wren and a robin. Flowers appear in groupings of three, signifying The King becoming the third monarch of his name.

A lion, a unicorn and a boar – taken from the coats of arms of the Monarch and Her Majesty's father, Major Bruce Shand – can be seen amongst the flowers. Her Majesty's arms are now enclosed by the Garter, following her installation as a Royal Lady of the Order of the Garter last summer.

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## The Coronation Quiche

A deep quiche with a crisp, light pastry case and delicate flavours of Spinach, Broad Beans and fresh Tarragon. Eat hot or cold with a green salad and boiled new potatoes - perfect for a Coronation Big Lunch!

1 x 20cm Flan Tin

Serves 6

### Ingredients

#### Pastry

- 125g plain flour
- Pinch of salt
- 25g cold butter, diced
- 25g lard
- 2 tablespoons milk
- Or 1 x 250g block of ready-made shortcrust pastry

#### Filling

- 125ml milk
- 175ml double cream
- 2 medium eggs
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon,
- Salt and pepper
- 100g grated cheddar cheese,
- 180g cooked spinach, lightly chopped
- 60g cooked broad beans or soya beans

### Method

- 1) To make the pastry...
  - a. Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using your fingertips until you get a sandy, breadcrumb like texture.
  - b. Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together into a dough.
  - c. Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes
- 2) Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.
- 3) Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge.
- 4) Preheat the oven to 190°C.
- 5) Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes, before removing the greaseproof paper and baking beans.
- 6) Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.
- 7) Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.
- 8) Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top with the chopped spinach and beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.
- 9) If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry case.
- 10) Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.

In Science, we have been learning about the parts of a flowering plant and also got to dissect and label real plants too!



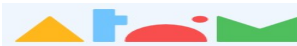
As part of observing over time, we have also sown some radish, rocket and tomato seeds to see how flowering plants grow.

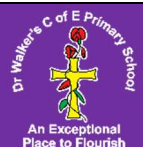

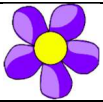

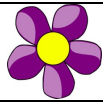
