

# Reception & Year 1

The shining sun allowed us to take our science lesson outside to explore plants. We looked around our local environment for wild and garden plants and the children were delighted to find an abundance of them! They worked compatibly together and discussed the flowers that they discovered.



#### **Years 2 & 3**

In their English work this week, Year 2 and 3 have been learning about the structure and features of a formal letter.

They conducted a science experiment to find out how plants absorb water, using coloured water to illustrate the movement of water through the structure of the plant.

In history, the children have used their knowledge of Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses to create their own, which will brighten up our classroom.

In computing, the children worked in groups to plan and act out a story without words, which they filmed. All the children showed great cooperation and imagination.

They thoroughly enjoyed their circus workshop too. Plates were spinning, juggling balls were flying and there was some impressive diablo work going on!
