Class news WILLOW CLASS

In Art and Design, we made the most of our amazing outdoor environment to collect natural resources and to make mud paint to create artwork. This gave the children a chance to develop their fine motor skills and to be creative with materials. We talked about our work and decided if it was abstract or figurative, allowing further opportunities to express their ideas and feelings.



SYCAMORE CLASS

This has been another busy week for Sycamore class! In their English lessons they have been learning to recognise and use the features of non-chronological report writing. They finished by researching tigers and creating their own information texts. In art the children have been learning how to draw a face, thinking about proportions and the placing of the features. In their geography work, Sycamore class have been comparing and contrasting the UK and Kenya. I think some of the children were quite surprised at how many similarities they could spot, despite being separated by so many thousands of miles! In PHSE the children have been discussing the very important issue of conflict resolution, recognising what constitutes bullying and how to resolve disagreements between friends. In their RE lessons the children have been exploring the complex concept of The Trinity, with particular reference to baptism in Matthew's gospel, examining contrasting artistic responses and creating their own.

In Geography, we are learning about rivers. We are thinking about what rivers are and how they are used. We started off by looking at the water cycle. Did you know that out of all the water on Earth, only 1% of it is available for us to use and drink - the rest is locked up in oceans and ice caps?

Next, we looked at the features of a river. The start of a river is called the source and the end of a river is called the mouth. We also looked at where rivers can be found. We used atlases to name and locate some of the world's longest rivers. We also used Google maps to locate the River Thames.

We found the source of the river (in Kemble) and used Google Street View to locate the upper course of the river. Next, we followed the river along to its mouth (in London), stopping to look at the street view at different points along the way and identified what river course is shown. At these different points, we also identified human and physical features.
