Year 2 and 3 have returned from their half-term break full of enthusiasm for learning. Hooray! They have been fascinated and moved by the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day landings. There were some very thoughtful and interesting comments made in our group discussions and they really enjoyed hearing the first hand experiences of some of the veterans when we watched Newsround together following Mrs Vorster's assembly. This week, the class began their unit on Shakespeare, thinking about why Shakespeare is important and using Shakespeare's language to create some wonderful Shakespearean insults, which we will be sharing as part of our class assembly later in the month. We started a new unit in computing on databases, learning about data fields and data collection by playing a game of monster Top Trumps. In French the class have started to explore habitats, linking to our new geography unit on food and its effect on the environment. Lucas has made remarkable progress with his confidence and even secured a medal for it from his football club!






### Well done!
